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Introduction

The SumerSports 2024 NFL Rookie Draft Guide is an advanced statistical look into the top skill position players eligible for the 2024 NFL Draft. These players represent the next group of stars as they transition from playing on Saturday nights to Sunday afternoons.

The positions included are quarterback, running back, wide receiver, and tight end. The data comes from our internal statistical modeling and includes tracking data courtesy of StatsBomb.

This guide is informative for all fans but has extra information for fantasy football players and dynasty managers. Our fantasy projections will help players prepare for their season-long drafts and calculate pivotal dynasty trades. Note that these projections were run before the NFL draft.

The players in this guide were selected based on their expected draft position (EDP) provided by Grinding The Mocks and our Superflex Consensus Big Board based on KeepTradeCut values . A few players that would have ended up within the rankings were unfortunately excluded due to guide length and player data.

Each rookie's projections are made by utilizing a player's draft position, the opportunity available on the team they were drafted to, their college statistics, and their combine measurements.

We hope that the rookie projections can help you understand where rookies should go in redraft, dynasty startup, and rookie draft formats. While there is uncertainty to making projections right after the draft, we hope that we will be able to update these throughout the summer as we learn more about the roles these players will play in their respective offenses.

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Glossary

A

ADoT (Average Depth of Target)

How far downfield a wide receiver is targeted on average calculated by total air yards divided by total targets (from StatsBomb). This is valuable to know whether a receiver is more of a downfield threat or someone who works more on shorter and intermediate routes.

Adjusted Air Yards

The quarterback's average depth of target adjusted for situation (from StatsBomb). This is a measure of a quarterback's aggressiveness in their offense.

Age

A player's age, in years, that they will be on draft day (April 25th, 2024). Age is an important input in many teams' draft day decisions because some younger players might be seen as having more room to develop.

Athleticism Score

A regression model built to predict what a player's Approximate Value (from Pro Football Reference) per game will be based on their combine results. For players with missing data, a K Nearest Neighbors imputation was used to fill in what was N/A and their overall score was slightly regressed to the median if they did not participate in every combine event. This could be helpful in understanding which combine events have a stronger correlation to NFL success.

Avg. Sep. (Average Separation)

The Euclidean distance between a pass catcher and the nearest defender on all of their routes, on average (from StatsBomb). While this can be influenced by route tree and offensive environment, it is still useful to see how well a pass catcher gets open.

Glossary

B

Broken Tackle %

The percentage of runs where the running back breaks a tackle derived by the number of runs where a broken tackle occurs divided by total rushes (from StatsBomb). This is a measure for how good a rusher is at getting away from defenders.

C

CPOE (Completion Percentage Over Expected)

The quarterback's completion percentage over expected. This is calculated by having an expected completion model based on a multitude of factors and then taking whether the pass was actually completed or not and averaging those results (from StatsBomb). This is a measure of a quarterback's accuracy as a function of their offense.

College Stats Comp With % Similarity

A nearest neighbors formula is used based on the box score statistics (yards per attempt, rush yards, etc.) and combine metrics (forty, three cone, etc.) to calculate how similar each player in this draft class is to every player drafted since 2005.

D

Deep Target %

The number of deep targets divided by a pass catcher's total targets (from StatsBomb). This shows how much of a deep threat a pass catcher was in college.

Glossary

E

EPA/Pass

A quarterback's total expected points added (EPA) on pass plays divided by their number of passes (from StatsBomb). This is a measure of a quarterback's production in their offense when passing.

EPA/Play

A quarterback's total expected points added (EPA) divided by their total plays (from StatsBomb). This is a measure of a quarterback's production in their offense when having the ball in their hands.

EPA/Rush

A rusher's total EPA divided by their total rush attempts (from StatsBomb). This is a measure of a rusher's production as a function of their offense.

Expected Draft Position

Based on Benjamin Robinson's Grinding the Mocks data, this is the average of where a player has been mocked based on hundreds of mock drafts. This uses the wisdom of the crowds approach to predict the draft and has performed well historically.

Explosive % (Receiving)

The number of explosive receptions divided by a pass catcher's total receptions (from StatsBomb). This shows how good a pass catcher is at breaking off explosive plays.

Explosive % (Rushing)

How often a rusher breaks off an explosive rush. This is one of the more stable metrics from college to pro.

Glossary

G

Gaps

How often a rusher runs in the A gap (between the center and guard), the B gap (between the guard and the tackle) and the C cap (between the tackle and tight end or outside of the tackle based on the offensive formation). This can help show you the style of runner that a running back is.

Games Played

The number of games played in a player's final collegiate season.

P

Pressure to Sack %

How often a quarterback takes a sack conditional on them being pressured. This is calculated by total sacks when pressured divided by total pressures (from StatsBomb). This is one of the more stable metrics for a quarterback from college to pro and gives you an idea of how they will avoid sacks at the next level.

R

Rank

Where a player ranks on the consensus big board relative to just their position group.

Rec. Yards/Game

A running back or receiver's total receiving yards divided by their total games played in their final collegiate season.

Glossary

Rush Yards/Game

A quarterback or running back's total rushing yards divided by their total games in their final collegiate season. For quarterbacks, sacks count as negative rushing yards.

S

Scramble %

A quarterback's total scrambles divided by their total dropbacks (from StatsBomb). This shows how often a quarterback is able to run in various situations.

Sep. in Air (Separation in Air)

The change in separation from when a pass is thrown to when it arrives to the receiver (from StatsBomb). This shows how a pass catcher is able to create separation while the ball is in the air.

Success Rate

How often a running back's carry goes for positive EPA (from StatsBomb). This is a good measure of how often a rusher is keeping the offense on track.

T

Target Share

How many times a pass catcher is targeted divided by the team's total pass attempts (from StatsBomb). The conventional belief is that targets are earned and this shows how well a pass catcher does at earning them.

Time to Throw

How long, on average, it took for a quarterback to pass in seconds after the snap (from StatsBomb). This is a function of how long the quarterback holds onto the ball in their offense.

Glossary

U

Usage Rate

The number of plays that a quarterback dropped back or ran divided by an offense's total plays (from StatsBomb). This shows how involved a quarterback was in their offense.

W

Wide Align %

How often a pass catcher is lining up as an outside receiver (from StatsBomb). This helps bucket receivers into slot receivers and out wide receivers.

Y

YAC / Rec. (Yards After Catch per Reception)

The amount of yards after the catch a pass catcher generates divided by their total receptions (from StatsBomb). This shows what a receiver can do with the ball in their hands after the catch.

YPC (Yards per Carry)

A running back's yards per carry calculated by their total rushing yards divided by their total rushing attempts.

YPRR (Yards per Route Run)

The receiving yards gained by the pass catcher divided by the amount of routes they ran (from StatsBomb). This is a measure of how productive a receiver is in their offense.

Glossary

Yards After Contact

How many yards, on average, a rusher gets after they are hit by a defender divided by the number of plays where they are contacted (from StatsBomb). This shows how well a rusher does at fending off contact.

Yards Per Reception

A receiver's total receiving yards divided by their total receptions in their final collegiate season.
